Learning	Acquisition
Memorization of lists and charts	Language is used in context
Focus on form	Focus on meaning
Emphasis on accuracy	Emphasis on proficiency
Conscious	Unconscious
Heavy use of English	90% + target language usage
Shelters grammar	Shelters vocabulary
Output-oriented	Input-oriented
Heavy use of monitor in all modes	Monitor only when writing
